June 2023 - Review of the Last Season

All 3-panellist confirmed that they had had a good, busy summer season, but highlighted a need for more events throughout the whole year, rather than over the already busy summer.

Royce mentioned that his summer season had extended out through to Easter this year and had already taken some enquires for Summer next year. There is a bit of concern around the cost for internationals traveling to NZ, and Northern Africa and Asia may be a competitive market due to price.

Jane-Maree had changed up her offering and invested in their boat, and another crew person, resulting in great feedback and further demand.



Jane-Maree mentioned that seasonality is always a challenge, and although she has great staff now, it was difficult to find them at the beginning of summer. Income has remained on par, however the cost of doing business is increasing, and will need to look at pricing for next Summer.

Ian spoke about the hardships of post-covid times for the hospitality sector such as looming fair pay agreements, minimum wage increases and the ripple effects across all staff, increase cost of goods and services and staff shortages. Summer was great, but Winter is going to be make or break for some venues.

There was some general discussion around the lack of venues open on public holidays and certain weeknights - Royce and Ian spoke about the additional costs involved of operating on public holidays that needed to be taken into account, as well as giving some staff a break. Overall, it was a great, interactive session and while there are definitely tough times ahead, everyone was looking forward to another busy summer season welcoming guests.
